In 1969, the U.S. Air Force published Lynn Catoe's comprehensive *UFO's And Related Subjects; An Annotated Bibliography*, which was prepared in the Library's Science and Technology Division under contract to the Air Force Office of Scientific Research in support of a project at the University of Colorado led by the late noted scientist Edward U. Condon.

The present bibliography, intended for the more general reader, provides selective coverage of the UFO literature that has appeared since that time, including some of the lively published debate that followed issuance of the "Condon report." The coverage is limited to English-language works but does include translations and materials published abroad. Other bibliographies are listed, as are books, congressional and other government reports, articles from journals and magazines (but not the daily press), and proceedings of conferences and symposia. In some cases, more than one edition of a book is listed (such as American and British editions) to assist interested readers whose access may be limited.
